



PE and Sport Premium



The Department of Education is providing all primary schools with additional funding to improve the provision of PE and sport. The funding calculation is based on the number of children at the school.

For 2016-2017, West Wimbledon received £9,885 in 2 instalments across the academic year.

Purpose of funding

Schools are required to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but also have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses for the funding include:

- hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE/sport
- providing places for pupils on after school sport clubs and holiday clubs.
- Investing in specialised PE equipment to enhance PE lessons.

West Wimbledon Primary School Vision:

The vision for PE at West Wimbledon Primary School is that as a school, we will endeavour to develop physically literate individuals who have developed a lifelong enjoyment of PE. We hope that they will have the knowledge, skills and motivation needed to equip them for secondary school and a healthy active lifestyle into adult life.

Objective:

To achieve the School's vision and advance PE at West Wimbledon, the school have identified 5 key objectives:

1. Raise the profile of PE across the school;
2. Increase the number and range of extracurricular clubs on offer;
3. Raise impact of participation in competitions;
4. Increase confidence, knowledge and skills of the teachers in the school within PE;
5. Develop an understanding of PE outside the school gates.

Professional Development

Throughout the academic year teachers and support staff attend PE coaching courses during and outside of school time which develop their understanding of a variety of sports throughout Key Stages 1 and 2, therefore giving them confidence to deliver quality PE lessons and more importantly having a positive effect on the development of essential skills of pupils throughout the whole school.

Providing places for pupils for after school sport clubs

The impact on pupils' PE and Sport Attainment and participation is measured by:

Merton Sports Mark Audit - Evaluates the provision of PE in the Curriculum at After School Clubs, special events and participations in competitive tournaments. Also identifies targets for development. **As a school, we again achieved GOLD standard this year.**

Using Merton Sports Partnership to support completion of Action Plan for School PE – identifying strengths and weaknesses.

Staff Feedback Survey : Given at the beginning of the academic year in order to assess strengths/weaknesses and areas for follow up CPD.

Pupil Surveys to evaluate enjoyment, learning and motivation gained from PE delivered by Fulham FC.

Teacher Assessments of PE lessons using standard format for Foundation Subjects

PE Leader and Senior Leadership Team evaluations of raised levels of sport participation, enthusiasm and skills

Monitoring of more able - children's participation and opportunities at a higher level through more able PE register
