Mathematics

In mathematics we will be looking at standards units of measure and 2D and 3D shapes. The children will take part in a range of activities that cover the following:

- To choose and use appropriate standard units to estimate and measure length/height (m,cm), mass (kg, g), temperature and capacity (l,ml) using rulers, scales and containers
- To compare and order lengths, mass, capacity and record results using < > and =.
- To identify 2D and 3D shapes.
- To describe the properties of 2D and 3D shapes including edges, vertices and faces.
- To compare and sort 2D and 3D shapes.

Other Curriculum Subjects

- Science: Plants— Children will be able to identify and name a range of wild and garden plants. They will understand and identify deciduous and evergreen trees. The children will build upon their Year 1 knowledge of parts of the plant and explain how they change as they grow. The children will plant seeds, observe changes and record data to represent these changes.
- History: The history of Wimbledon Tennis, studying historical changes that take place in our locality. Trip to All England Lawn Tennis club to take part in a workshop on the history of Wimbledon Tennis (3rd May 2017).
- RE: The Christian Bible— The story of Joseph (linking to DT), the story of Ruth and Naomi (linking to PSHE topic of relationships). Learning about the structure of the bible (old and new testament).
- PSHE: Relationships— Looking at the different relationships in our lives, recognising that we treat people differently depending upon our relationship with them. Thinking of ways in which we can have happy relationships with one another.
- DT: Joseph's technicolour dream coat. The children will design, make and evaluate a colourful coat for Joseph using a range of materials.
- Computing : Researching a topic, using search engines to find information about Wimbledon. Learning how to be critical and selective of sources.
