





Teacher	What was your favourite subject when you were at school?	What is your favourite children's book?



My favourite subjects were Biology and Literacy. I wanted to write children's stories in my house on the beach. Perhaps one day I will!




My favourite school subject was History as I enjoyed learning about the Tudors.

I loved art at school, anything vaguely messy and creative was always something I could easily get involved with!









I liked English and Dram. English because I liked reading novels and creative writing. Drama, as I enjoyed being in plays, playing different characters.

My favourite subject at school was English because I like writing stories and using my imagination.




History was my favourite subject: I love learning about people who lived in the past and love teaching it now too.


The most enjoyable lesson during my primary schooling was art, DT and anything creative. even today I love to make and create new things.

My favourite subject at school was English Literature.



When I was at school, I liked creative writing. When you write, you can express yourself using your imagination.






Art. I thoroughly enjoy using my creativity to create classroom displays and imaginative role play sceneries for the children to explore.


My favourite subject at school was Modern Foreign Languages because Greek was my first language and I had to learn English very quickly. I studied French, German and a little bit of Italian.


My favourite subject at primary school was English, I loved reading and writing.

I loved P.E. at school. As a child I was very competitive and I really enjoyed being part of a team and learning new sports.




I love Computer Sciences. I have always been interested in technology and love to learn how to do new and interesting things on the computer and the interactive whiteboard.

I love 'The Gingerbread Man'. The repetition is really fun and there are a lot of nice actions you can do.



